Concept Note

Background

At this crucial juncture, where the international community is forging a better path forward through the *Pact for the Future*, the official side event, *Interfaith Youth Responses to the Century's Biggest Challenges: Faith-Based Contributions to the Summit of the Future*, will provide a dynamic platform for youth and diverse religious leaders, and experts to articulate their vision and explore actionable solutions for a brighter tomorrow. The side event is co-organised by *Religions for Peace* and the Islamic Cooperation Youth Forum (ICYF), in partnership with the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) Faith for Earth Coalition, the Republic of The Gambia and Uzbekistan.

Discussions will focus on the crucial role of youth, inspired by faith and core values, as agents and catalysts for addressing global crises and building communities of the future. It will touch on fostering faith as a source of and a foundational inspiration from which springs the fountains of hope, peace, mental wellbeing for ensuring a healthy environment for all within a framework of holistic development.
